Carol married her high school sweetheart and their two boys who joined them later. "Big" Jerry was the love of her life and she loved her boys "Little" Jerry and Kevin. In her later years, the boys were of great help to her to keep her in her home. Carol had a love of animals and always had a dog. The latest was Molli who passed away this winter. Her three "granddogs" were a great part of her life.

Carol admitted she caused her share of trouble in school. She spent a lot of time with the school social worker and later in life they met again in water exercise. Of course this time on a social basis.

Carol loved her gambling and really enjoyed being able to go to Deadwood, S.D. and Blackhawk, CO. whenever she could. She enjoyed playing bingo and doing pull tabs in Cheyenne. She often reported winning several hundred dollars, but then how much did she spend?

Gambling got Carol into X-JWC. She was a substitute for Bunco and became interested in our organization. She joined in 2011 and was very active. She was extremely crafty and made centerpieces and came up with craft ideas. Carol made corsages for the dignitaries for the 75th anniversary party for X- JWC. She was always the one who sold the most tickets for any event.

Everyone loved Carol and she loved everyone. She loved to have company, be on the go and to host a fun party. It was sad, but most of us didn't get to see her after March because of COVID. Some of us often visited with her on the phone. She had some rough times the last few years of her life, being in and out of the hospital, but she always held her head high and made the most of life. She left us on June 2, 2020 to join her husband. We miss our "Bubbly" Carol. We will carry her in our hearts forever!

In Memory of Mildred Treber

Mildred became a member of GFWC Junior Women's Club in 1967, and to this time was the longest serving member of X-JWC. She joined before the organization became X-Junior Women's Club. It was a thrill of her life to receive her 50-year pin in 2017. She was a great supporter of X-JWC and regularly attended meetings until the last few years. According to her daughter, Judy, they visited about X-JWC frequently. She supported our fundraising events, always about the first one to get her money turned in. She indicated to her daughter, that she thought that we selected good Community Improvement Projects, as well as other projects that we choose to do for the community. Judy indicated that X-JWC was one of her favorite groups.

Mildred grew up on a farm and went to a small country school. Her husband, Leonard was drafted after 2 years in college to join WWII and Mildred went into nursing school in Denver. They were married in Abilene Texas when Leonard was in the service. When they came to Cheyenne, (which was supposed to be short term, but they ended up living here till both passed away) Mildred worked for Memorial Hospital. She worked with the Board of Nursing, a founding member of the Hospital volunteers raising money for scholarships supporting children and educational opportunities for women. Leonard preceded her in death. She passed away December 25, 2020 and would have been 100 January 19, 2021. She and Leonard contributed mightily to this community. She is missed, but still with us in our memories!

XJWC BYLAWS

The bylaws below will be considered for amendment and voted on at the upcoming club meeting. The additions to the bylaws are in red; existing bylaws are in black.

Article III. Meetings

Section 1. Regular meetings. GFWC X-JWC of Cheyenne shall hold its meetings the first Tuesday of each month, September through May. A quorum shall be fifty percent plus one (1) of the club membership. Meetings may be suspended by the Board of Directors due to inclement weather or a national or state emergency. Meetings may be held virtually at the direction of the Board of Directors.

Section 2. Board of Directors meetings. The Board of Directors shall meet once a month, with the exception of May, June and July, at such time and place as the President shall determine. A quorum shall be fifty percent plus one (1) of the board membership. Meetings may be suspended by the Board of Directors due to inclement weather or a national or state emergency. Meetings may be held virtually at the direction of the Board of Directors.
