Marcia has been the go-to person for many of the club's activities and would like someone to take over this these two functions, while she continues in her other roles. Both areas go well together and involve keeping the yearbook updated and membership applications submitted for approval.
- ❖ Edna Larsen made a motion to reimburse Marcia for her expenses in putting together baskets for various organizations. It was seconded and approved. Edna also suggested making it a line item for the budget, in the amount of \$1,000.00. The motion passed unanimously and will be presented at the next general meeting.
- ❖ Office supplies line item in the budget was also increased by \$100 to help offset the costs of mailing and ink cartridges.

At the Board Meeting on April 11, 2023, a motion was made (and passed) by Sue Arguello to approve the following donations:

Ray Lovato Recycling Center: \$100

The Alzheimer's Walk: \$200. The walk will be on Saturday, August 26th. We will donate a basket for this event. It was suggested that we get a team together to walk.

Dr. Haque Dental: \$300. This helps support dental surgery for children whose families cannot afford it.

St. Christopher's Highway Travel Assistance: \$200. This organization has been greatly taxed due to the rough winter and large number of stranded travelers.

Power of the Purse for Hospice: \$300. Marcia Volner has donated six purses, and April Dittman is going to donate additional purses.

Art Box: \$150. More money is needed to decorate utility boxes in the community.

Western Wyoming Family Planning: \$300 plus basket. On October 21st, the WWFP will host a masked ball to raise money.

The McKenzie Home: TMH will also be having a fundraiser dinner in the Spring of 2024. Donating to this cause will be discussed at the Board meeting following Holiday House.

The Food Bank of Sweetwater County: \$250. The need for food assistance has been rising each year in our community.

Cow decoration: \$\$200. Members with artistic talents are encouraged to help decorate a cow to be displayed at an appropriate location.

These donations will be voted on at the April General Meeting.

A motion was made by Edna Larsen to use money set aside in the by-laws to be divided evenly among those going to the Wyoming State Convention. It was seconded and approved.

Sundance Academy – This is a new concept for grades K through 12. It will be for kids who are not thriving in the school district. The school district will either lease a building or repurpose the Washington School in Rock Springs. Marcia Volner suggested inviting a speaker to one of our future general meetings to explain the plans for this school.
