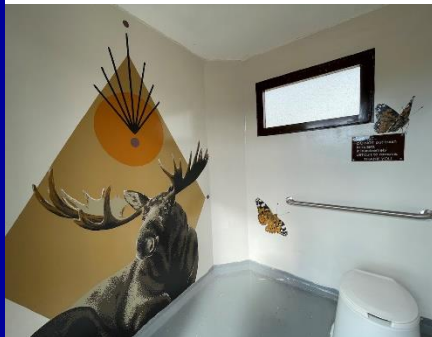
GREENWAY CLEAN UP. Saturday, September 23, 9:30 a.m.

Bags and light gloves (plastic, disposable) will be provided. Bring your own gloves if you prefer heavier ones and trash pickup stick if you have one.

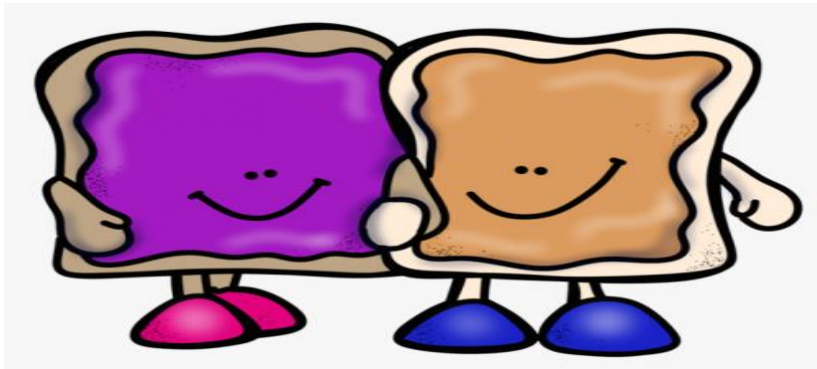

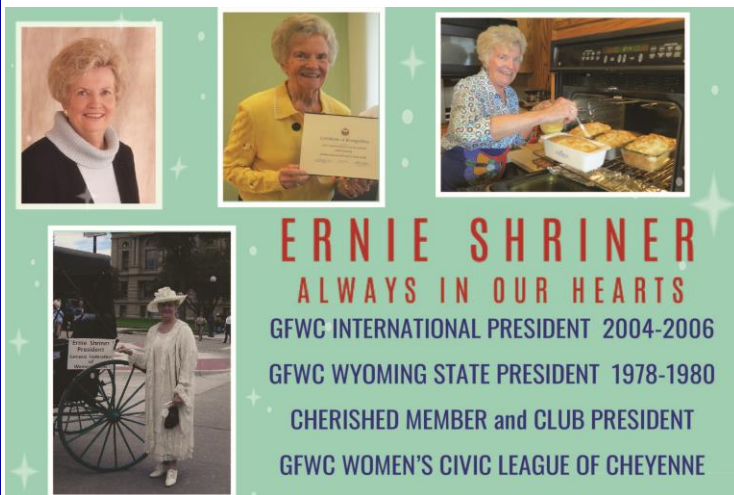

Trish Peoples, GFWC-Wyoming President, presented the following remembrance during General Session of the Convention:

“Ernestine Shriner, Ernie to her friends, was GFWC International President from 2004-2006. When Wyoming Clubwomen speak of Ernie tell of her grace and mentoring abilities. When she asked someone to do a job, she didn't just ask and let it go. Ernie made sure that resources and support were provided for any project, whether at the club, state or international level. She gave a great deal of support and encouragement to members. You always felt that she had your back and was ready to share her inspiration and knowledge.

Ernie was a generous friend and leader. She made time to visit, offer guidance, and advice when asked. She had a way of helping you figure out what needed to be done, often over a cup of Starbucks, without telling you what to do. She knew how to get things done and how to inspire others to follow her lead.

Ernie loved the staff at Headquarters and was grateful for their knowledge, the help they provided to members, and for their contributions to the success of GFWC. Ernie appreciated the contributions to the Federation by those who came before, sharing stories of how many had helped in her journey, thereby providing inspiration and education to those who were new to the wonderful world of GFWC. She was proud to add her special project to the list of GFWC accomplishments -- Literacy: Tutoring from the Heart.

When Ernie was able to come back to Wyoming for a visit and to attend a club or state meeting, she would graciously visit each table, working the room, connecting with old friends and introducing herself to those she had not met, welcoming those new to the organization. She was always in high demand to conduct installations at the club and state levels as her inspirational messages and special gifts for new officers, which were carefully chosen by Ernie, became cherished memories.

A few years ago, when her club presented her with her 50-year membership certificate, Ernie gave that beautiful smile and displayed the certificate for photos just as she had for all those photos as international president with state award winners.

It is a difficult task to describe in relatively few words the impact Ernie Shriner had on Cheyenne, on Wyoming, GFWC-Wyoming, and GFWC International. The many people she touched through those associations, as well as her business and other volunteer activities are countless. The poem, *The Dash*, comes to mind when thinking of Ernie.

You have probably heard this poem by Linda Ellis many times, but when we lose someone as dynamic and important to GFWC as Ernie, it bears repeating.”

I read of a man who stood to speak at the funeral of a friend, he referred to the dates on the tombstone from the beginning...to the end.

He noted that first came the date of birth and spoke of the following date with tears, but he said what mattered most of all was the dash between those years.

For that dash represents all the time they spent alive on earth, and now only those who loved them know what that little line is worth.

For it matters not, how much we own, the cars.. the house.. the cash.

What matters is how we live and love and how we spend our dash.

If we treat each other with respect and more often wear a smile... remembering that this special dash might only last a little while.

AIRPORT FOUNTAIN REDEDICATION and HISTORIC AIRPORT TERMINAL OPEN HOUSE

Saturday, September 9, 2023

It was a beautiful day! Women's Civic League was recognized by Milward Simpson, Chairman of the Cheyenne Historic Preservation Board, as a donor to the fountain restoration project during his remarks about the history of the fountain and the long road to completing the restoration. There were interesting presentations on the history of aviation in Cheyenne, and the many steps over the years needed to restore the fountain. The Airport Fountain Park is now the newest Cheyenne City Park.

Arts Cheyenne is working with the Cheyenne Regional Airport to renovate and repurpose the circa-1961 Terminal into a new community space. They are looking for community input and hope to design a public arts and aviation history space that serves the public's desires and needs. A grant from the National Endowment for the Arts is helping with the project.

Our donation in 2020 to the fountain project was a Community Grant Committee award from 2019 Christmas House proceeds. A project we can all be proud to have helped bring to fruition and will enjoy for years to come!
