The pair end up at the home of three black sisters, the oldest who has a successful beekeeping business.

Lily is searching for knowledge about her mother who died tragically when Lily was 4. Through lessons in beekeeping and living with the sisters during the Civil Rights movement, Lily learns more about herself and her life than she could have ever imagined. Karen says it's an "easy" read and Heart Touching.
