November is Prematurity Awareness Month through the March of Dimes and as you know, it is one of my President's projects to support their efforts. Here is an excerpt from the committee chairman at GFWC:

Why we fight.

The U.S. is facing an urgent maternal and infant health crisis. It's one crisis, not two. This crisis is not just about the health of babies born too soon, it's also about those we've lost, including the moms who have died and those who face serious health challenges before, during and after pregnancy.

- In just one year, more than 22,000 infants die in the U.S. alone, and 1 in 10 are born preterm.
- Premature birth and its complications are the largest contributors to infant death in the U.S.
- The U.S. preterm birth rate is among the worst of highly developed nations and increasing more for women and children of color.

This is not fine. With our partners, we are working to make a difference and expand solutions that we know can improve outcomes for moms and babies.

During the month of November — Prematurity Awareness Month — we aim to break through the noise and drive awareness around the issues facing moms and babies in our country...#ItsNotFine. We must act. Join us.



Small Projects/Big Results from Jeanne Urban, CPR Committee Member

An example of using your communications and public relations is stated below.

"We are such a small club (membership of six), what can we do to make a difference?" As their advisor some hints were given which they took to heart and put to good use.



- While shopping they informed people everywhere that they purchased Dr. Seuss books and told them why they were buying the books and where they were going to be donated when taken to the GFWC Annual Convention.
- The club began gathering shoes and donated them to Soles4Souls, explaining to those donating about this project.
- For their last project they gathered over 20 gowns plus accessories and took them to the local air base for the military women, explaining to them the Grand Initiatives for GFWC. They accomplished three of the seven initiatives. This could be considered a big result from a small club.
