August 18, 2020 marked the centennial of the adoption of the 19th Amendment by 3/4 of the states, Tennessee being the deciding state, providing the support necessary under Article V of the Constitution of the United States. August 26, 2020, Women's Equality Day, marked the centennial of the 19th Amendment becoming a part of the Constitution of the United States, providing for women's suffrage.

In Wyoming, women had already been exercising their right to vote for 51 years! The Wyoming Suffrage Act was passed in 1869, when Wyoming was still a U.S. Territory.
