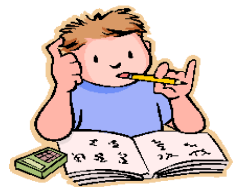

Convention Awards -- X-JWC received a recognition certificate for our monetary donation to Canine Companions for Independence Give a Dog a Job program. GFWC Wyoming was recognized with first place certificates in our GFWC membership category for the Signature Project: Domestic Violence Awareness and Prevention Program, and Home Life Community Service Program. It is a thrill to have Wyoming recognized for all the hard work our Wyoming clubwomen do for our communities!

SEVEN GRAND INITIATIVES

You may remember hearing about President Mary Ellen Brock's 7 Grand Initiatives announced in 2018, to be completed over the two years of her administration. X-JWC participated enthusiastically last year – we collected shoes, Dr. Seuss books, participated in MLK Day of Service, got trees planted, joined the Legislative Action Center, and more.

At Convention we were excited and anxiously awaited the announcement to hear how GFWC clubs fared over the first year. Well, the cheers were deafening when the numbers were announced! We smashed the two-year goals to smithereens in just one year AND we still have a year to go to meet the challenges!

New BRAND INITIATIVES

Having done so well in the first year with the Seven Grand Initiatives which will continue this club year, President Mary Ellen has issued three new **Brand Initiatives**.

Brand Initiative #1 – That 1,000 calls or emails will be made to United States Representatives on September 23, 2019 urging passage of **Miranda's Law HR 2793**.

Brand Initiative #2 – That 1,000 calls or emails will be made to United States Senators and Representatives on October 23, 2019 urging passage of the **3D Printed Gun Safety Act of 2019**.

Brand Initiative #3 – That 1,000 club/state projects will be in place to celebrate the 100th **Anniversary of Women Winning the Right to Vote**, August 26, 2020. This can include supporting the House and Senate bills to create a new series of commemorative circulating coins to highlight women suffragists on the reverse side of the U.S. quarter.

GFWC Legislation and Public Policy Committee and the Brand Initiatives

The first two new Brand Initiatives relate to bills that 2018 Region conference attendees voted to support through GFWC Resolutions. President Mary Ellen has asked, and the GFWC Legislation and Public Policy Committee is encouraging members to support passage of the two bills by contacting their Congressional delegations, urging their support on September 23 and October 23, 2019. Additional information will be available on how to support these two Brand Initiatives as well as the Centennial Quarter Dollar Coin Program Act at the September meeting.

We have the power of thousands of GFWC members to make a difference in our communities. Let's make it happen! Dr. Seuss's the Lorax states, "Unless someone like you cares a whole awful lot, nothing is going to get better, it's not."
