We had our first board meeting of the club year on August 28<sup>th</sup> at Pointe Frontier which was well attended. I am so thankful for the board and for all they do to serve our community.



At the meeting the Board decided to recommend a collection at the September meeting for the Maui fire fund. All funds collected will be sent to the Hawaii Community Foundation, Maui Strong Fund which is recommended by GFWC. Funds will be used to help the people affected by this terrible disaster. At future meetings I will be collecting for the students of Laramie County School District #1 to help pay for school meals. Many students can't afford the cost and so there have been a build of funds owed which takes away for paying for other things that the students need. I appreciate all your support with my project from last year, Rooted in Cheyenne, which received over \$600 from your donations! Hopefully we'll be as successful with this year's projects.

X-JWC signed on with GFWC's National Day of Service initiative to fight food insecurity. A suggestion was brought to the Board to support Meals of Hope which the membership will be asked to vote on as our project. Meals are packaged and then given to local food banks. The meal to be packaged is oatmeal with extra nutrients. Other clubs will also be participating with the hope of packaging about 10,000 meals. The club will be asked to donate \$100 for this project. If this is passed at our meeting on Tuesday, club members are encouraged to participate on September 18<sup>th</sup> at 1:00 pm at Element Church to help package the meals. I hope we get a good attendance at this service project.

We already have many things planned for this year. We will be doing a trolley ride to see the statutes on Capitol Avenue and we will have a few fund raisers to support our CIP project, K9s4Mobility. Speaking of which we will be taking part in the Meadowlarks Market on October 28<sup>th</sup> so please plan on making some baked goods, providing some crafts or working there that day. #### GFWC X-JWC CLUB PRESIDENT'S 2023 – 2024 PROJECT

This year President Lucy Russell has chosen the "Feed It Forward" program at Laramie County School District #1. The program is managed by LCSD #1 Nutrition Services and operates on donations. Principals throughout the district have access to the account to assist students who do not have sufficient funds in their lunch accounts due to circumstances beyond their control and for those who do not qualify for meal benefits.

The District's goal is to ensure that students are safe and well-nourished while they are at school as that plays a major role in their academic readiness and overall well-being. A student's school meal debt is a barrier to success. Last year school meals were free as they were fully subsidized under federal COVID-19 relief funds. Since those funds are no longer available districts nationwide went back to previous meal charge policies. Jars will be on lunch tables each month for members who wish to place donations for the program.

#### **GFWC NATIONAL DAY OF SERVICE**

GFWC is encouraging all clubs to participate in the National Day of Service to help end hunger in the United States by volunteering, donating, or organizing a community service program on September 30 (or a date convenient for the club). At the September club meeting, X-JWC members will be voting on participating in the **Meals of Hope** food packaging event on **September 18** at **Element Church** from 1:00 to 3:00 and providing a \$100 donation. After moving to Cheyenne in 1999 she joined X-JWC, volunteering to bring birthday cakes to veterans at the VA Hospital and serving on many club committees. She continued to support the Yoder club traveling with X-JWC members to help with the annual fund raising dinner.

In 2011, Phyllis joined a group of veterans on an Honor Flight to visit the World War II Memorial in Washington, D.C., where she was thanked for her service by Wyoming's congressional delegation. Many years she attended the Memorial Day and Veterans Day remembrances in Cheyenne with X-JWC club members. We were honored to have her as a club member and will surely miss her.
